Dear Families,

It is incredible that we have got through this half term already; it has been a cold and long winter but just like the daffodils peering through the snow in school garden, there signs of a hopeful spring to come! The infection rates are coming down locally, but we stay vigilant, following social rules; keeping our two meter distance; wearing masks and washing our hands. We continue with these measures in school along with complying with twice weekly testing taken by staff. We ask you wear masks at pick up and drop off, inform us if you or a member of your household has contracted COVID and follow the isolation advice. Thank you

There will be some changes to next half term's learning with live zooms on Monday—Thursday and a catch-up Friday!

Class teachers will only have zooms to instruct on four days a week. The curriculum on Friday will be remote arts from music, philosophy, PE and art lesson which are set or pre recorded, whilst maths will be the arithmetic on forms and English a comprehension in the CGP book. Teachers set 5 Maths, 5 English lessons per week, a science, Religious Education and History & Geography lesson. This amounts to roughly 15 pieces of learning that need to be handed in via the google hand in function, every week.

Three lessons per day, every day. Please check daily. We are monitoring this and getting back to families to inform and support. If you have requested but not received support in technology please email Rachel. Finally, I know you will join me in thanking the teachers for weaving their magic along with us thanking you for your support in your child's learning. Hopefully, we will get to see more light soon. 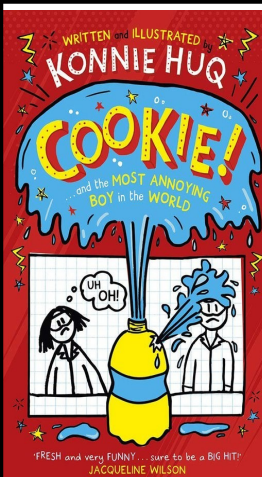
