In maths we continued deepening our understanding of numbers 1-10 and focused on learning to write our numbers the correct way around, counting forward as far as we can (accurately) and counting backwards also. We looked at 1 more/ 1 less and simple addition. We also looked at 3D shapes, learning their names and looking at the properties of shape. The children particularly loved our learning about patterns. They have been recognising, identifying, and creating their own patterns. The maths learning this term has been incredible and we are all very proud of how focused and enthusiastic the children have been. Keep it up Reception!

We have had a fun this half-term learning about different animals and their habitats as part of our Paws, Claws and Whiskers topic work along with being creative making our own story books based on the book 'Croc and Bird' by Alexis Deacon. We loved learning about what type of animals hatch from an egg and really enjoyed watching something hatch. The children listened to a non-fiction text about tigers and then had the opportunity to write their own non-fiction report about tigers, act it out as presenters and present it to the class. We had a lot of fun and it really showed off the children's acting skills.

We have also had an amazing time in Maths where it was full of experiments. We have been getting to grips with Measurement: Length, Mass and Volume and are now able to use measuring equipment such as, rulers, scales and measuring jugs accurately.

Science Week gave us an insight in to what it is like to be a scientist as well as finding out about invertebrates and how they camouflage into their habitats. We loved learning about insects and the children have taken their science knowledge into break time and have actively looked for invertebrates within the school grounds.

RE has been very exciting during this half term as we indulged straight into Easter. We learnt about many different elements relating to Easter for instance, how hot cross buns had a connection to Easter. After investigating, we had a taster session involving hot cross buns. Talking about eating, we have also been learning about various religious stories that relate to the story of Jesus on the cross, such as the story about the Monkey King and the mangoes, where the children even had the opportunity to taste some mangoes in class.

Apart from all the learning, we had fun too dressing up to celebrate Book Day and Comic Relief. As we approach the Easter holiday, we have been learning about the significance of Holy Week and reflecting on the importance of this Christian celebration.

This half term the children have had another packed few weeks with plenty of learning. It has been brilliant to see the progress that the children have been making in all areas of their learning ahead of next half term's SATS.

In English the children have really enjoyed the learning that they have been doing around the story of Rapunzel. The story was revealed to the children slowly over the course of the half term and they enjoyed the different twists and turns to the story as it differed to the original version. The children used some fantastic adjectives in their writing including the adjective impudent which means to be



rude. We have also been really impressed with the progress that the children continue to make in their reading. Children are moving through the different levelled books that we have and are working towards their goals for their reading papers in Summer 1.

R.E. involved the children answering the key question of 'What Christians believe God is Like' with the focus of forgiveness being the main point and how the father in the story of The Prodigal Son forgave his son after he left and spent all his share of his inheritance.



In maths we have learnt about 2D and 3D shapes and have finished this half term with fractions. We will continue to practise fractions after the holidays as this is quite a challenging concept for the children to understand. Keep practising the timetables with the children as the progress they are making here is wonderful and it really helps when solving other mathematical problems.





Science looked at forces and how different things move and the forces that are involved in this. We looked at making our own toy rockets, flying fish and how scooters move.

Castles has been the theme for our humanities learning and their different features. We spoke about the history of castles and naming their features. We then looked in more detail at different towers and tunnels from around the world.

We hope that the children have enjoyed the learning this half term and that they have a good rest over the summer ready for the summer term. From all of us, have a wonderful break and a Happy Easter.



We've had a fantastic half term in Year 3, learning all about predators and the animal food chain. Some fun facts that we have collected:

 Predators are found on every continent and environment in the world: hot deserts, icy polar wastes, rainforests, jungles, mountain tops, valleys, forests, oceans and lakes.



- The biggest living predator is the blue whale. It measures over 30 metres in length!
- Jellyfish, snakes and wasps have special mechanisms that stun or poison their victims.
- The Venus flytrap, sundew plant, pitcher plant and bladderwort plant catch flies and insects for their prey. Yum!
- Some tropical pitcher plants are even large enough to catch small lizards and mammals such as rats!

We have had a fantastic half term in year 4, progressing on to fractions in maths. The children have done really well to build on their previous knowledge of fractions, retaining all the important terminology, and using all their new-found times tables skills to help with equivalent fractions.

We have been developing our narrative and persuasive writing while reading The Demon Dentist in English. The children have rewritten the opening chapter from the book and they have really made it their own, it has been fantastic reading these and sharing them with the class. We have also developed our persuasive writing skills, with the children writing a letter to persuade the book's lead character to brush his teeth. It has been really fantastic to see that some of year 4 have been using their new knowledge to spot persuasive language being used in advertising campaigns outside of school.

In science, we looked at teeth and eating. The year 4 children are now able to tell the difference between the teeth of a herbivore and a carnivore, and they are able to identify different types of teeth in the animal's mouths as well. Our love to investigate saw us soaking two eggs in vinegar overnight to see what effect acids had on the eggshell. We saw that toothpaste can help protect the enamel on the eggshell, just like it protects the enamel on our teeth from the acids in our food.

In RE we looked at forgiveness, and we had a lot of fun roleplaying the parable of the unforgiving servant. Year 4's acting was truly on form!

It was a shame to say goodbye to swimming, but we have enjoyed the cricket we have been doing instead. This half term I enjoyed doing fractions and learning about the Demon Dentist in English and all of the experiments in science. I enjoyed doing football and art and learning about teeth and the human body and the digestive system. I also enjoyed world book day when I dressed up like Billionaire Boy. Alfie T
