Dear families,

This week our focus was British Science Week, a ten-day celebration of science, technology, engineering and maths. This year's theme - connections! To celebrate, pupils from Reception through to Year 6 looked at their favourite scientists and their inventions. Although characterised in the past as having a conflicting relationship, science and faith have actually had a dynamic relationship, and have more often been complementary to each other; natural theology is the idea that people can discover things about God, including the questions of God's existence, by exploring the natural world. This is a core area of our curriculum from forest school to gardening lessons - connecting with nature promotes positive spiritual, mental and physical health!

Pupils have enjoyed home learning about scientists from Mary Anning to Marie Curie, and Isaac Newton to Charles Darwin. In class, they have 'Loved to Investigate', taking part in experiments to observe science in action, including looking at areas including aerodynamics, and water and air resistance. Staff from both St. Saviour's and St. Paul's with St. Luke's joined to have a staff meeting with the Royal Institute of Science. There is a scientist in us all, waiting to discover our wonderful world!

To carry out work the work it will be necessary to suspend all on-street parking bays and close the road for the duration of the works.



THAMES Music Centres and **Ensembles**

Saturday Music Centre

Orchestras, choirs, chamber groups, bands – the SMC develops students' musicianship and technical skills through playing with others. Open to musicians aged 7-18 who are Grade 1+ and have instrumental/vocal lessons.

Wednesday Music Centre

The WMC is for children in the elementary stages of learning. It features a range of ensembles including strings, wind, brass, orchestra and choir. Open to beginner musicians aged 7-11 who are having weekly instrumental/vocal lessons.

Soundbox

Soundbox is an all-ability inclusive ensemble that brings together disabled and non-disabled musicians aged 11+ to make and create music using a mix of traditional instruments, music technology and singing. No prior experience

The Children's Choir is for singers aged 7-11 and offers an opportunity to learn new songs, develop vocal technique and sing together as a choir. No prior experience necessary.

Youth Orchestra

Tower Hamlets Youth Orchestra is the borough's leading youth ensemble. The orchestra meets for intensive rehearsals during school holidays, has recently toured Germany and also held residential courses outside of London. Open to musicians aged 11+ and Grade
















Holiday Childcare Easter Scheme 2023
