Partial closure due to strike day

Dear parents/carers,

You may be aware from media coverage that the NEU have declared strike action, which will take place on:

Wednesday 15th March 2023 Thursday 16th March 2023

The strike is happening because of a national dispute between the unions and the government over teachers' pay and workload.


