Next Steps - Transitions

Half Moon Theatre, funded by Tower Hamlets Council for a sixth year, are running a boroughwide project to support Year 6 students with their transition to secondary school. **All sessions are FREE**, and your child's teacher has suggested that your child would benefit from taking part.

Half Moon will be coming into St. Saviour's to run a taster with Year 6 and to have a meeting with parents about the programme afterwards.

Please attend this parent meeting at 3.30pm on Wednesday 24th May.

All children will be offered **FREE After School Club** sessions that will take place at **The Reach Community Hub, 11 Oliphant Street, E14 0GB** (a 6 min drive, <u>10 minute</u> bus or 14 min walk from St Saviour's).

If you live in a different part of the borough, we also have sessions in Limehouse, Bow and Shoreditch.

In these after school clubs, Year 6 children will critically engage with themes such as **positive** friendships, bullying, online safety, identity, good decision making and new responsibilities.

If your child enjoys the sessions, or they are unable to attend the above dates, they will be offered a place in our FREE Summer School - a week-long summer project at Half Moon Theatre, where we continue to use drama as a tool to support participating young people to get ready for their move to secondary school. Your child will also be offered FREE weekly after-school sessions when they are in Years 7 – 9 and offered further support in secondary school if required.
