ATTENDANCE MATTERS

Good attendance relates to good attainment. Every day counts! At St Saviour's School regular attendance is important to ensure the best possible learning outcomes for all our children. It helps our children make the most of their education, improving their chances in adult life. Regular attendance and punctuality are also important life skills which will help our children when they enter the world of work. Our children receive certificates and prizes for good attendance half termly, termly and for the full year. Classes with the best attendance win day trip. Attendance for each class is monitored and shared weekly. Our attendance policy is on our school website. Paper copies are available from the office displayed outside each classroom. In addition to this we expect our children to be punctual. The school gates open at 8:45 and close at 8:55, giving you 10 minutes to get your child into school. Children are expected to be in class for the register by 9:00 am, ready to start their first lesson shortly afterwards. Being punctual means that lessons can start on time, enabling staff to maximise children's learning. Your child will be given a late mark if they arrive in class after the register has been completed. If your child is absent from school due to a medical reason, please ring the school office by phone before 8.40 am. We will contact you if we haven't heard by this time as part of our safeguarding procedures. We understand that illness happens and if your child is not well then, they may need to stay home, but we ask if your child has a runny nose, a headache or seems very tired that you still bring them into school. The below chart outlines how much learning is lost through non-attendance. Please do make sure your child is in school and ready to learn every day. Thank you.





LET'S MAKE A CHOIR!

A three-day summer programme for young singers in East London

Who is this programme for? Any child aged 7-11 with an interest in music or singing.

Does my child need to have had music lessons or passed exams? No: all experience levels are welcome.

How much does this cost? It is absolutely, 100% free!

Who will lead this programme? Jonathan Pease, Director of Music at All Saints' Poplar. Jonathan is an experienced choir director, passionate about music in his native east London.

Who is offering this programme? The Tower Hamlets Deanery: a group of Church of England churches in the East End.

So is this only open to church-goers? No! The programme focuses on sacred choral music, but it is open to children of any faith or none. The course ends with Choral Evensong at 3.30pm, sung by the children: families and friends are welcome to attend.

Can my child come to both weeks? If you like! Both weeks are different but self-sufficient, so you can come to either or both.

Can I leave my child there? Yes. The programme is staffed by DBS-checked adults in line with Government childcare ratios.

Will you feed my child? Lunch is provided free of charge.

Sounds great! How do I sign my child up? Just send a short email to choir@poplar.church including your child's name and which week(s) he or she would like to attend.
