#### Dear Families,

I cannot believe that the year is almost over, it seems to have flown by and as we prepare for the new year our focus along with the end-of-year celebration events we are also considering transition. This week our year 6 took part in the Deanery Leavers service at All Saints with the other year six pupils in Tower Hamlets Church of England Schools. This is an annual event for children to meet and get to know each other before their transition days at secondary schools. It was wonderful to be part of a wider family of schools and know they can make a friend in their next steps along their journey. The children were wonderful.

Change can be a tricky time for some even if it is an inevitable part of life. We know that changes will come, the things we can do is prepare for them and welcome them as potential for a new beginning. For children change can be unsettling because of the sense that when the adults change their expectations change. We try to alleviate this by transitioning to the new class with the new team in the last week, so we can avoid the summer butterflies in anyone's tummy. Anxiety and anticipation can be supported with getting to know each other and establishing expectations before we start.

Consequently, on Monday 17th and Tuesday 18th July, the children will go to their new year groups in a especially put together curriculum, art and PHSE timetable. They may have people they are familiar with and new people. Schools rarely stay the same and teachers do move about in school and beyond.

A taste of what is to come includes: Looking inwardly at what makes us unique as people, the gifts we all bring to make our school and class a better place and our hope for the future. Looking within our group to the social rules, rights and responsibilities we share if we are to love one another as Jesus taught. On the curriculum focus, children will experience a little maths and English from their new year group as well as considering how they learn and how their brains work. Some children do need additional explanations or support and this can happen with the individual

teams for support.

## Poplar – wide cricket



## **LET'S MAKE A CHOIR!**

A three-day summer programme for young singers in East London

Who is this programme for? Any child aged 7-11 with an interest in music or singing.

Does my child need to have had music lessons or passed exams? No: all experience levels are welcome.

How much does this cost? It is absolutely, 100% free!

Who will lead this programme? Jonathan Pease, Director of Music at All Saints' Poplar. Jonathan is an experienced choir director, passionate about music in his native east London.

Who is offering this programme? The Tower Hamlets
Deanery: a group of Church of England churches in the East End.

So is this only open to church-goers? No! The programme focuses on sacred choral music, but it is open to children of any faith or none. The course ends with Choral Evensong at 3.30pm, sung by the children: families and friends are welcome to attend.

Can my child come to both weeks? If you like! Both weeks are different but self-sufficient, so you can come to either or both.

Can I leave my child there? Yes. The programme is staffed by DBS-checked adults in line with Government childcare ratios.

Will you feed my child? Lunch is provided free of charge.
