Voluntary Aided School Contribution

As you would be aware, as a Voluntary Aided School we rely heavily on the support of our families and as part of our admission agreement we ask families for a £30 voluntary contribution towards the LDBS Maintenance fund.

We ask for these contributions during the first half term of every new academic year- September to July.

The contribution will need to be paid via ParentPay – please see Clare in the school office if you require further assistance on this.

The school has to pay the London Diocesan Board for Schools £30 per pupil, per term, whether we receive the contributions from our families or not. We therefore ask for the £30 voluntary contribution per family and not per child.

As you would appreciate, this has an impact on our school finances, therefore your support is vital!
