Today the children were visited by PCs Stephen and Omar from the Tower Hamlets and Hackney Metropolitan Police Youth Engagement Team. For children in years 4, 5 and 6 they spoke about how the police support children in schools and the impact of hate crime, cyber bullying and racism. They also told the children which services they can contact if they feel that they are a victim of any of crimes.

After the pandemic, some families and children have struggled to go back to routines and attendance at school. We know that every second counts, when children miss school they are out of step with their peers, they miss their friends and vital parts of learning concepts that impact on their achievement in reading, writing and maths as well as across the curriculum. Sometimes they miss opportunities to go out on trips or have fun doing something else that is irreplaceable in making memories and establishing relationships. Unless you are able to establish relationships, relate with the adults and your friends you may not be able to regulate your emotions in the same way or develop the resilience you needs to flourish.

If you are struggling to support your child's attendance do let us know how we can help you. To enable this we will not be agreeing any holidays in term time.

Polite reminder:
Children need to be in school
on time.

Gates open at 8:45 and close at 8:55.

Early morning learning at this time sets the children up for the day.

Our Attendance Welfare Officer (AWA), Ranu Begum, attends school every Tuesday morning. Ranu checks our school registers regularly and will contact parents & guardians by letter or telephone. Meetings and home visits will be completed if there is a cause for concern.

Formal referrals of pupils with persistent absence or below 90% attendance will be made. Children need to be in school every day. Parents should be aware that they can ultimately be prosecuted for non-attendance offences.

We know that sometimes- even with children at school 190 out of 365 days in the year- they may fall ill. This can be worrying so please see advice from our local teams on

on common illnesses and when to seek support. Additional sports including swimming benefit children to be healthier and smarter. Please ensure children take full advantage of this by wearing appropriate kit and making sure they bring it with them each week!
