

Charging Policy

All education during school hours is free. We do not charge for any activity undertaken as part of the National Curriculum.

Voluntary contributions

When organising school trips or visits which enrich the curriculum and educational experience of the children, the school invites parents to contribute to the cost of the trip. All contributions are voluntary. If we do not receive sufficient voluntary contributions, we may cancel a trip. If a trip goes ahead, it may include children whose parents have not paid any contribution. We do not treat these children differently from others.

Residential visits

If the school organises residential visits in school time or mainly school time, which is to provide education directly related to the National Curriculum, we do not make any charge for the education expenses. However, we do make a charge to cover the costs of board and lodging. All school journey visits are currently subsidised by the school. We do not give grants for school journey.

After-school clubs

Currently the afterschool clubs are Hockey, Dodgeball, Basketball, cricket, tennis. The charges are £3 per session which is paid in advance. The duration of each club is 6 weeks. We also offer a stay and play session £3 per child or £5 total for additional sibling.

Nursery top-up fee

For parents who are not in receipt of the 30 hour nursery funding, we offer a top-up payment scheme. The charges are £10 per day, the payment is paid half-termly via ParentPay

Breakfast club

The charge for breakfast club is £1 per child per day. This is paid in advance every half term. We do accept children under special circumstances which may include children whose parents have not paid any contribution, exceptional circumstances are agreed by the Executive headteacher
